Global Surgery Day Workshop

The 9^{th} annual CUGH conference is just around the corner! Happening March $16^{th}-18^{th}$ in New York, CUGH has come to be the world's leading academic global health conference. Since its inaugural meeting in 2008, the number of registered attendees has grown from 327 to more than 1,800. This year's conference, entitled, "Health Disparities: A Time for Action," includes several different tracks/subthemes and satellite sessions. Some of the highlights include Global Health Law, Human Rights, and Conflict Prevention, Neglected Topics in Global Health, Social Determinants of Health and more.

GICS member Neema Kaseje and her colleagues Wesley Sequeira, Maria Lucia Espinosa, and Sara Estrada will be attending and are presenting an abstract on the Nicaragua partnership baseline assessment.

In addition, in association with CUGH, the 2nd annual <u>Global Surgery Day</u> will be held March 15, featuring a full day workshop on <u>Disparities in Global Surgery: Building Systems and Networks through Collaboration.</u> Dr Walt Johnson will be speaking about National Surgical Planning, and several other GICS members will be speaking as well, including Drs Miliard Derbew, Emily Smith, and Steve Bickler.
