New year's greetings to all members of GICS

GICS has accomplished much in 2018, thanks to you all!

Looking back at the year...

First and foremost, GICS held a third successful meeting in Vellore, India in January, hosted by GICS member Vrisha Madhuri at the Christian Medical College. Attended by 109 people (two-thirds from LMICs) from 31 countries, the two days were packed with presentations by GICS members, along with plenty of time for networking and enjoying the company of friends and colleagues.



This year also saw new leadership for GICS, with Kokila Lakhoo becoming the new Chair, Emmanuel Ameh the Chair Elect, Neema Kaseje the Secretary, and Doruk Ozgediz the Treasurer.

A Grants and Funding Advisory Group, led by Dan Poenaru and Emily Smith, was formed to assist GICS members with applications.


GICS also introduced a Nurses Working Group, led by Bunmu Lawal-Aiye, who gave a nice summary in the November 2018 newsletter.

GICS Chair Kokila Lakhoo led a successful Global Surgery Course at Oxford University in September 2018, featuring GICS Board Member Tahmina Banu and others.

Professor Lakhoo also continued a partnership between the Royal College of Surgeons and GICS Board Member Vrisha Madhuri, leading courses on surgical care at secondary hospitals in the southern India.

GICS Secretary Neema Kasege continued to lead a program to improve surgical care in Nicaragua, including hospital work and data collection.

KidsOR had a tremendous year, opening several fully equipped operating theatres in Ecuador, as well as various African countries, with plans to expand to Southeast Asia and Nepal. A Biomedical Engineer in the UK provides support to existing ORs, and data collection ensures ongoing evaluation of the impact of the projects.



GICS member Naomi Wright began data collection for her ambitious Global PaedSurg project, collecting invaluable information on congenital anomalies in countries throughout the world.

In November 2018, GICS Board Member Keith Oldham and others accompanied the KidsOR team to Ecuador and established connections with leaders in children's surgery there.

And finally, GICS published 2 landmark papers in the World Journal of Surgery, one an article on GICS itself, and the other a comprehensive summary of the Optimal Resources in Children's Surgery (OReCS). These publications will further increase

awareness of GICS as a leader on the global surgery stage and hopefully serve to guide inclusion of children in national surgical, obstetrics, and anesthesia plans (NSOAPS) in the years to come.

Many things are planned for 2019...

Work will continue on developing subspecialty-specific training modules for the District Hospital, using OReCS as a guide.

The GICS Research Webinar will continue its monthly meetings, encouraging all interested GICS members to attend.

Membership dues will be introduced, to help defray operational costs of the organization. Dues will be waived if they are an excess financial burden.

GICS Board Member Stephen Bickler will serve as the GICS representative at the annual meeting of the International Surgical Society in Krakow, Poland in August 2019.

In November 2019, GICS will help organize a session on global surgery at the World Congress of Pediatric Surgery held by the World Federation of Associations of Pediatric Surgeons (WOFAPS) in Doha, Qatar. The program will include presentations on NSOAPS, KidsOR, OReCS, the Nicaragua project, and the St Judes/WHO cancer project.

And finally, plans will be underway for the next meeting of GICS in Johannesburg, South Africa 6-8 February 2020.

We thank everyone who contributes to GICS, and we look forward to another productive year together!
