Global PaedSurg Collaborators needed

Naomi Wright, member of the GICS Core Operations and Logistics team, is currently seeking collaborators for the upcoming Global PaedSurg research project and would like to encourage all GICS members to join. Currently there are 260 collaborators from 130 hospitals in 77 countries, and she aims to enlist collaborators in every country of the world.

Global PaedSurg is a multi-centre research collaboration of surgeons, anaesthetists and allied health professionals caring for neonates and children requiring surgery across the globe. This aims to be the first large-scale, geographically comprehensive prospective cohort study on the management and outcomes of congenital anomalies in low-, middle-, and high-income countries across the globe.

Participation in the study should not be time consuming for each individual collaborator and centre – it will involve collecting data on 7 conditions over a minimum period of 1-month (longer duration optional).

Data is to be entered into a pre-designed, user friendly, free of charge database – REDCap.
